Weekly Reflection

We held our remembrance service on Monday of this week. Members of the school council and the worship leaders helped to lead the service and we were joined by Rev. Sally Moring who reminded us why poppies are a good symbol of remembrance.



The main focus of the week has been antibullying. The school council has taken an active part in planning and delivering activities, supported by the worship leaders in weekly reflection yesterday. Children have been reminded what bullying is, the difference between banter and bullying, the need to be respectful to everyone and what to do if you experience bullying.

Weekly Highlights

Year 3

Year 3 have enjoyed learning how to use Seesaw and creating their own stop frame animations in their computing lessons this week,

Children have enjoyed creating botanical observational drawings using natural objects this week, remembering to use their line and shading skills.

Year 4

Year 4 have shown great curiosity when looking at the importance of Mary to the Christmas story. They have also learnt how to sing in unison when singing The Gift of the Nile song in music – a very harmonious year group.

Year 5

Year 5 learned more about being a champion for people who are being bullied this week. On Wednesday we had a conversation about banter and bullying, and became quite able to distinguish between the two.

Year 6

On top of their usual studies, all of Year 6 have been hard at work writing their own scripts and practising for the upcoming class assemblies.

Child-led Art Competition

Well done to all the children who entered the art competition run by children in the school.

Prizes were given to the top four entries and the winning entry will be used as a logo by the school council for their work this year on mental health and wellbeing.



Pupil Voice

The school council has held their first meeting and have been busy planning and delivering presentations and activities as part of national antibullying week. They will be going on to lead a range of activities throughout the year designed to promote mental health and wellbeing.

Worship Leads continue to play a vital role in school. They not only help to plan and deliver collective worship, but also facilitate the weekly reflection sessions that are held in class each Thursday morning. They will soon be meeting with members of the local church team and school leaders to review this term's activities and plan for the spring.

The Eco Team are busy in school, making sure that waste food is recycled, that energy is used as efficiently as we can – lights and equipment off when not is use – and that we provide recycling for other items, such as batteries.

Details about this will be shared soon (please do not rush out to buy a Christmas jumper – the emphasis will be on upcycling and raising money for Save the Children rather than buying a new Christmas jumper).

Parent Engagement

Thank you to everyone who was able to attend the parent consultations this week. We hope that you found this a useful experience and enjoyed looked at your child's books. Thank you to everyone who managed to find items of lost property. It was lovely to hear your positive comments about the school and what your child has experienced so far this term.

Class assemblies are starting next week, beginning with Year 6 (Year 5 will be in the spring term) and our carol service will be on Wednesday 18 December in St Mary's Church, Wendover (Y3&4 10am and Y5&6 11am); we hope that you will be able to join us.

Extended Learning

Getting children into good habits regarding independent work is a really important part of getting them ready for secondary school. We have clear expectations about the extended learning that our children should complete each week and encourage them to adopt a 'little and often' approach.

ReadingPlus and doodlemaths are provided for children to increase fluency. We are providing a doodle club at lunchtime for all children to help them and we are rewarding children for their efforts at home and in school. Please ensure that your child engages with these platforms at home – contact the school office if you are having difficulties accessing them.

We are proposing to run a maths workshop for parents on Thursday 5 December in school. This will be a chance for parents to learn more about how children learn calculation, how they use manipulatives and the importance of improving fluency. Scooters

We have received concerns about the safe use of scooters on campus, particularly by older children at WCEJS. Children currently have the privilege of using a scooter to come to school on. They know that they need to come directly to school, walking their scooter along the pathways whilst on campus. They should always be mindful of pedestrians.

Children have been reminded of our expectations this week. Please reinforce this message with your child if they use a scooter. We will be monitoring the use of scooters over the next few weeks. Children who cannot use them safely may lose the privilege of bringing them to school.
