Know what dynamics are in musical terms, and identify changes in dynamics when listening to music	
Begin to make links between a piece of music and the course of a river (link to prior learning in Geography)	
Sing a melody in two parts – using expression and dynamics.

Explore ostinato by singing the 4 parts in different combinations within a group.	
Create a rhythmic ostinato on untuned percussion, based on different courses of a river.	
Know how to play my ostinato in time with other performers, and maintain the pulse of the music.
