### **Autumn term review**

This term has been a very busy and successful one. Following on from our review of behaviour and curriculum last year, we have introduced our revised curriculum progression documents and the WINKS (What I Need to Know documents). Children are using the WINKS across the curriculum to help them better understand what they need to know and what they have learned. We have continued to develop our use of high participation strategies, designed to keep all children engaged and to embed learning. We are thinking even more carefully about learning activities, making sure that they give opportunities for deeper thinking. Teachers and LSAs have further strengthened their understanding of how to scaffold learning, particularly in maths and English.

The School Council has launched their mental health and wellbeing passport, a programme of activities that we will explore across the year with all children. Worship Leaders continue to play an important role in all classes, helping others to reflect on the weekly themes and taking an active roll in planning, delivering and evaluating worship.



Digital Leaders and the Eco Team have both led important initiatives this term, helping children to remain safe and to make positive choices that will help to care for the planet. Wellbeing ambassadors and Junior Road safety Officers have visited the John Hampden Infant School as part of our their safety week and our Y2 transition package. Junior Librarians have also helped to develop our school library.

Children have truly lived the virtues and values that we promote. There have been many pupil-led fundraising activities for many worthwhile causes — I am sure that this will continue next term. The PTA have provided exciting opportunities for children and raised funds that we be spent on further improving our school. Our Y3 performed fantastically in their Nativity and each of the year groups has experienced a good deal of curriculum enrichment through visits and visitors to the school.

I would like to thank: all our staff for their hard work and resilience this term; our governors for their continued support; our parents for your support, your kind comments and generous donations to the PTA fundraisers and the Aylesbury Foodbank.


#### Year 6
