Reflection

This has been a very busy and successful half-term at Wendover CE Juniors. Children have settled into their new classes and the high participation strategies are working effectively. The revised WINKS (What I Need to Know) documents are being used as learning tools in all subjects, with children eager to highlight what they have learned. Whole class guided reading and a renewed focus on the use physical resources and pictures in maths is helping children to make even better progress (manipulatives such as as bead strings and pictorial representations, such as bar-modelling).

Our pupil voice groups have been elected with many children taking on a leadership role (school council, Eco Group, Worship Leader, Wellbeing Ambassador, House Captain etc) and there continues to be a wide range of clubs and activities. There have been a number of successful charity sales organised by children, further evidence that our virtues of courage and compassion are being lived.

In response to parental feedback (summer survey), we have further improved communications; in particular, we have revised the format of the newsletter and have added content to the website so that parents are more informed about the work of the school. It was lovely to see that Harvest Festival was so well supported. We look forward to welcoming you into school for parent teacher consultations after half-term.

Weekly Reflection

Remembrance has been the theme this week, as we prepare for our service on Armistice Day. We've thought about why the poppy is a good symbol for remembrance (see next page), as well as how we can help others (sometimes having to make a small sacrifice such as time or doing something that we might not want to do).

The school council will be taking the lead next week as it is national antibullying week. The main theme of this is respect. They have been working hard to provide activities that we share the important message that we should respect everyone and that bullying can never be tolerated.



Look at your poppy.

Poppies are bright and cheerful flowers: give thanks to God for the lives of those who have died in war, remembering all the joy they brought to families and friends, and all the good things they did for their home and their country.

Then look at the red petals: red reminds us of danger and harm. Ask God to be close to those who are still facing danger each day, to give courage to the armed forces, and compassion to all who help others.

Place your whole hand over the poppy: poppies are also fragile and need to be handled gently. God cares for those who are hurting and those who are sad. Ask God to comfort all who are grieving the loss of someone they love.

Finally place a finger on the centre of the poppy: ask God to help you play your part in working for peace in the world.

The school council and worship leaders continue to do a sterling job. Our Eco Team is also hard at work, ensuring that food waste, amongst other things, is properly recycled and that we are saving energy where we can.

Our wellbeing ambassadors and junior road safety officers have also been sharing important messages this week with children at the John Hampden.

Online Safety

As part of our Computing curriculum we address online safety and appropriate online behaviour. Children are taught to understand that their interactions with others online should be respectful and positive. We also discuss how the school values - the 4Rs, can help us to behave appropriately. We regularly remind children what they should do if they see upsetting content online or on devices which have internet access such as phones, tablets and games consoles.

Children are taught to speak to a trusted adult at home or in school, a school Designated Safeguarding Lead, or even speaking to a friend who can support them with finding an appropriate adult to help. Children should also leave a website or chat open to show an adult so that they can see the content which has upset them.

Attendance & Punctuality

As you know, we make regular checks on attendance and punctuality. Statutory guidance has changed over the summer, which means that we will be monitoring attendance even more rigorously. We are legally obliged to share attendance information with parents. Most of the communication will be for your information only and will require no action. In a small number of cases, further support or action may need to be discussed – this will be clearly set out in the communication. To ensure consistency across the local liaison group of schools, we have a shared policy and we use model letters from the local authority.
