Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back to another year at Wendover CofE Junior School! The year 6 team are very excited about the year ahead. The children have settled well into their new class groups and are very much looking forward to all the exciting events that will take place this year. We wish the children a wonderful time in year 6 and we look forward to seeing them flourish over the coming year.

In this letter you will find some key information regarding routines, dates and some of the events that will be taking place over the year.

#### The Staff

#### **Expectations**

I am sure you will agree that having high expectations for every child is important. As the children are now the oldest in the school, we place a much greater emphasis on behaviour, independence, maturity and organisation, and ask that the Year 6 children are excellent role models for the rest of the school. Children are encouraged to hold a role of responsibility, such as: Head Pupils, Prefects, House Captains, Well-being Leaders, Social Time Monitors, Eco Warriors, Librarians and Junior Road Safety Officers amongst others. These roles prove to be very popular with Year 6 and a child who does not secure the role they initially applied for will be given the opportunity to try for a different one.

#### **School Uniform**

All children need to wear the specified school uniform every day and ensure they wear it correctly. Black school shoes should be worn – no boots. Children should come to school with a suitable coat to keep them warm and dry when they go outside to play. All clothing must be named. In addition, long hair should be tied up with a plain hairband (black, grey, red or white). Jewellery is kept to a minimum (optional wristwatch and one plain stud per ear). Nail varnish is not allowed in school. School trousers / shorts should not be tight fitting, e.g. leggings, and skirts should be of appropriate length and cut. Please refer to the school uniform policy for further guidance (this can be found on our website under the 'key information' section).

#### <u>PE</u>

It is essential children have their PE kit in school every day. Children are expected to change their socks for PE and tights should not be worn. Scheduled PE sessions will take place on a Thursday with Premier Sports. In addition to this, once a week, children will also be taught PE by their class teacher or as the case this term, this session will be swimming. Swimming sessions are due to start towards the end of September on Tuesday – you will be notified of this soon. Children need their swimming costume in school on a Tuesday. All kit must be named.



## **Extended Learning**

By setting extended learning, we aim to develop independence and organisational skills. We encourage children to complete tasks to the best of their ability and seek help from staff if support is needed. All work will be uploaded onto eSchools on Monday and should be completed by the following Monday.

You child may refer to these words as the metal words or copper, bronze, silver, gold, platinum words. The Wendover Spelling Challenge words can be found on the school website. Please support your child to learn these at home ready for their test.	Your child will be tested half termly. If they manage to spell all the words correctly, they will receive a certificate in celebration assembly. Your child may be tested for more than one certificate per half term. Dates will be confirmed nearer the time.	At your own discretion
