## Worship

In our last week on **inequality and injustice**, we thought about how Sikhism encourages everyone to respect and care for each other.

Children watched a news story from New Zealand, in which a Sikh man was faced with a difficult choice: should he uphold one of the prohibitions of his faith (not removing his turban in public) or should he use it to help give first aid to a child involved in a road traffic collision. Children decided that Harmanpreet was a good Sikh for helping to save the child's life.

We then thought about how we might have to make difficult choices when 'calling out' inequality and injustice.

# Campus Safety

As you are probably aware, the organisations on campus supervised vehicle movement on two days this week. Thank you to everyone who followed the rules and drove safely; thank you also to those who passed on positive comments. It is clear that many of you appreciated the reduced traffic.

To help further improve safety, we have asked that the following reminders are shared with all parents and staff using the campus:

- Only attempt to drive beyond the barrier if you are authorised to do so; display your permit or be ready to show ID as required
- Do not allow passengers to get out into the road - use the drop off bay at the campus entrance; pedestrians should use the footpaths – including adults
- DO NOT PARK OR WAIT in the drop off bay; doing so can create a traffic hazard
- DO NOT PARK on double yellow or hazard warning lines
- DRIVE SLOWLY – there is a 10mph limit for a reason

## Adverse Weather

As the weather gets colder, children need to be prepared. We encourage all children to wear a coat and to bring extra layers for PE (these do not replace the black sports shorts and house T-Shirt – they are additional layers). If it is very wet underfoot, children may wear alternate footwear to school but must change into their school shoes once in the building.

It may be necessary to switch to remote learning if we experience extreme weather (ensure that your child has their login details for eSchool – which they use each week for homework). This switch will always be as a last resort and will be for health and safety reasons. The school will contact the local authority, who in turn contact local radio. We will post on our school website and will also endeavour to text parents. Please do not contact the school office to ask if school is open.

We cannot make decisions about safe travel for individual children and families. Please report any child absence in the usual manner.

# Attendance

We know that there is a clear link between high attendance, academic progress, good mental health and wellbeing and the development of positive attitudes. We also know that children are unable to attend school sometimes and that we may ask parents to collect their child early if they are really unwell.

Schools are required to monitor attendance more closely than ever. The government has introduced new attendance targets: every school needs to show that they are continually improving and not just that they are above the national average.

We have revised our procedures, in line with the national and local authority requirements. Regular attendance checks are carried out and we keep parents informed. You will receive a letter if your child's attendance is below 90% and we meet with parents if attendance is not improving. We are obliged to refer children to the County Attendance Team if they have 10 or more unauthorised absences in a 10 week rolling period. All leave of absence must be requested through the school office.

Y3 children have enjoyed finding out their parts for the Nativity and practicing their songs and lines. Children have completed their first week of Multiplication and division in Maths.

## Year 4

We are looking for three qualified swim instructors to support our school swimming lessons on Friday afternoons at the Wendover Pool.

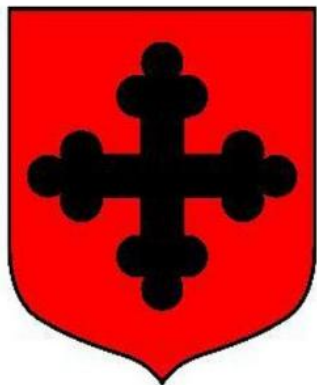
